Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-17

Let us think about how we can bring light to the lives of others.

When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he went away to Galilee. He did not stay in Nazareth, but went to live in Capernaum, a town by Lake Galilee, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali. This was done to make what the prophet Isaiah had said come true:

"Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali,
on the road to the sea, on the other side of the Jordan,
Galilee, land of the Gentiles!

The people who live in darkness will see a great light.
On those who live in the dark land of death
the light will shine."

From that time Jesus began to preach his message: "Turn away from your sins, because the Kingdom of heaven is near."

What do you remember from the Gospel reading?

It talks about people who lived in darkness seeing a great light. Who do you think the people living in darkness were? Where do you think the light came from?

One way of thinking about this is that when we are sad or lonely, everything feels dark and gloomy. This is the dark. But then when someone does something nice for us, like including us in their game or making us laugh, everything seems brighter again. This is the light. This is the light that Jesus brings into the world.

We all live in one world, with the same sun shining down on us. We are all God's children and belong to one family. Jesus asks us to look after each other. If we do this we can help the light of Jesus to shine in the world.

What will you do this week to make the light shine for someone, either here or in another part of the world?
