#### **Autumn Term**

#### **Comprehension:**

#### **Grammar and Punctuation:**

- Use prepositions accurately
- Use pronouns and noun phrases to add clarity and cohesion in writing
- Use dialogue to emphasise the differences between spoken and written speech
- Apply powerful verbs to convey a degree of meaning to the reader
- Expand noun phrases by the addition of modifying adjectives, nouns and prepositional phrases
- Extend the range of sentences with more than one clause by using more ambitious conjunctions
- Apply the present perfect form of verbs in contrast to the past tense
- Use fronted adverbials with commas
- Use conjunctions to convey the passing of time, inject suspense and shift attention
- Use expanded noun phrases to expand sentences

# **Spring Term**

- Use inverted commas accurately to indicate dialogue
