Autumn Term

Comprehension:

Spring Term

Comprehension:

- Discuss and evaluate the author's use of language, including figurative language, considering the impact on the reader
- Summarise the main ideas in a chapter
- Discuss their understanding of what they have read
- Ask questions about the text to improve understanding
- Cite strong and thorough textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text
- Provide an objective summary of the chapter
- Determine the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text
- Infer a character's feelings by analysing their actions
- Determine an author's point of view or purpose in a text
- Identify and discuss the conventions used when presenting arguments

Composition and Transcription:

- Select appropriate grammar to enhance meaning
- Precis longer passages
- Write in the style of the author
- Reinforce the use of commas for clarification of meaning in writing
- Draft and write by selecting appropriate vocabulary
- Identify the audience and purpose of the writing
- Assess the effectiveness of an author's writing style
- Propose changes to vocabulary choices by using a thesaurus to identify synonyms

Grammar and Punctuation:

- Revision of verb tenses, brackets, dashes and commas, complex sentences, subordinate conjunctions, auxiliary and modal verbs
- Recognise different types of sentence and conjunction and think about their impact
- Use homophones and homonyms accurately
- Use Standard English accurately
- Organise work using paragraphs accurately

Summer Term

Comprehension:

- Explore the meaning of words in context and their impact on the reader
- Consider and discuss the author's development of character
- Retrieve and record information accurately
- Provide reasoned justifications for their views
- Cite textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text
- Investigate structure and meaning of a text
- Justify inferences using evidence from the text
- Make predictions using evidence from the text
- Explore the meaning of figurative language

Composition and Transcription:

- Propose changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance writing and clarify meaning
- Assess the effectiveness of their own and other's writing and make amendments
- Link ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time
- Ensure the consistent and correct use of tense throughout a piece of writing
- Ensure correct subject and verb agreement
- Linking ideas across paragraphs using adverbials of time
- Build cohesion across paragraphs using a range of devices
